The incident	<p>The US FDA issued a notice advising restaurants and retailers not to serve or sell and consumers not to eat certain shellfish from Oregon and Washington due to possible contamination with paralytic shellfish toxins.</p> <p>Affected products:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Certain oysters and bay clams harvested from OR growing areas in Netarts Bay and Tillamook Bay, harvested on or after 5/28/24 ● Shellfish species from growing areas in Willapa Bay, WA: Stony Point, harvested between 5/26/24 and 5/30/24; Bay Center, harvested between 5/29/24 and 5/30/24; and Bruceport, harvested between 5/29/24 and 5/30/24. <p>Details of products being affected are listed in the website of the the US FDA.</p>

Position of CFS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acquisition of the products through international travel cannot be excluded. • Paralytic Shellfish Poisoning (PSP) toxin can cause symptoms such as numbness of mouth and limbs and gastrointestinal discomfort. In severe cases, paralysis with respiratory arrest and even death may occur. This natural toxin is sometimes found in bi-valve shellfish. It is heat-stable and cannot be destroyed through cooking.
